Welcome back to Osborne School!

I would like to start by expressing how wonderful it is for us to finally be together again as a school. Although the support and encouragement expressed over the last several months has been outstanding, nothing compares to actually being together and seeing the smiles of our students each day.

This year there are many changes in how we do things at our school, but our core beliefs remain the same. The safety and well-being of our students remains our top priority, followed closely by our commitment to providing a high-quality education. We are indeed a small school, with a big heart and this idea underpins everything we do in our community. We also recognize that the differences that we will experience this year will provide us with opportunities to grow and possibilities to explore. I am glad that we have the chance to go on this adventure together.

As part of our commitment to finding new ways to learn, we will continue to develop our outdoor classroom. We have received a program enhancement grant from the Saskatchewan Rivers School Division. Construction is expected

to begin on the physical structure once the school division staff has had a chance to deal with the unusually high volume of service requests this fall. In the meantime, we have started collecting items that can be used as outdoor seating (lawn furniture, milk crates, 5-gallon pails, benches, etc.) so that our students can get outside to learn. If you have anything that might be useful, and that you wish to get rid of, please let me know.

One final change that I would like you to be aware of is the addition of several people to our staff this year. Teresa Miller has joined us to teach our grade 2/3 class, and Sydney Marchant is returning to Osborne as an EA in Mr. Bragg's 6/7 class. Becky Eyre is an intern who will be joining Mr. Bennington in the 7/8 room until December. Each of these people has jumped right in and excitedly joined our team and I know they will be a great addition to our school.
