Being in class each and every day is of vital importance to the academic success of our students. It may be difficult to see in the moment, but research shows that regular absences (1-2 times a week) begin to erode away at our students' opportunity to build skill in reading, writing, and mathematics. This creates a gap in learning that only widens with continued absenteeism. Parents can encourage their children to attend daily by:

- Setting regular bedtime and morning routines
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Avoid letting children stay home unless he/she is truly sick
- Know that sometimes complaints of sore stomachs and headaches are signs of anxiety
- Talk with teachers, school counsellor, and/or myself for advice on how to alleviate a child's anxiety about going to school or other issues.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid scheduling extended vacations and trips when school is in session.

As always, we appreciate everything that our parents and those in our school community do to support our students' education. Truly the success of our children is a partnership, and we value all of our partners! Have a wonderful October and we hope to see you during the month!

Dear Parents/Guardians:

<u>LETTER OF FAIR NOTICE – Prince Albert Risk Assessment Protocol</u>

The Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division Board (SRPSD) is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors and community members. We believe that by working together with students, their families, and the community, we can support young people to be healthy and happy.

Our principals, vice-principals and school social workers receive training developed by the <u>Centre for Trauma Informed Practice</u> to lead a process called Assessment of Risk to Others (ARTO). This training has led to the development of a community protocol to help principals protect students from potential threats to safety or serious harm. The protocol helps schools respond quickly to threatening incidents.

The Prince Albert Community Risk Assessment Protocol outlines how schools will respond to threatening or worrisome behavior. Principals will convene a School Risk Assessment Team, which typically will include the principal/vice-principal, a school counselor and a police officer. Depending on the severity of the potential threat, principals may also consult with the Superintendent of Schools and call in members of the Community Risk Assessment Team. This Community Team may include representatives of community agencies such as local Police, Mental Health and Addiction Services, or Child and Family Services.

Parents and guardians will be notified as soon as possible in the ARTO process. If parents/guardians cannot be reached or if they choose not to provide consent, the risk assessment may still proceed. Personal information shared throughout this process will respect and balance each individual's right to privacy with the need to ensure the safety of all.

This letter is to serve fair notice that SRPSD will take decisive action when a serious threat has been made. Our goal, as always, is to ensure student safety in a caring learning environment.
